Book of Exodus, Session 4 The Passover form the primary motivation for the Jewish custom of telling the Exodus story every year on Passover It is also a reminder that it is through telling a story, rather than through proving historical veracity somehow, that meaning and values are to be communicated

The ritual meal that includes the telling of the story of Passover is called a seder. In Hebrew, seder means "order." This story of freedom is told in a set order, which becomes the name for this Passover meal. This order is spelled out in a book called the Haggadah. There are many, many versions of this book, which dates back almost 2,000
